III. Appendix E. Women Veterans from Holy Cross and the NROTC Unit

1. First page, first paragraph:
 - Replace paragraph with the following paragraph:

After Holy Cross went coeducational in 1972, it didn't take long for Holy Cross alumnae to be commissioned into the military. Captain Margaret Simoneau, '75 USPHS (Ret) is the earliest woman graduate with commissioned military service. Though she was not a member of the NROTC Unit, she was commissioned a Navy Ensign in 1983, transferred to the US Public Health Service in 1989, and retired in 2013 after 30 years on active duty. As with Captain Simoneau, not all women who served were commissioned from the NROTC Unit. Well over 100 Holy Cross alumnae have entered the Navy, Coast Guard, Army, and Air Force either through the NROTC and AFROTC Units at Holy Cross, or through Officer Candidate School.
