Beverly Ford Rappahannock
August 15. 1868

My dear Jennie

I dropped you a note this morning, but since I have received yours of the 12th Inst. informing me of the cause of your recent illness. It was too bad darling but it was one of those misfortunes that should not rest heavily upon our hearts. I am very glad you told me about the matter because however painful it is a satisfaction to know.

It is a great pleasure to me also to observe dear, that we are both of a mind about woods and their value when weighed in the scales of the heart. We are both forgiven by each other. You said nothing dear but that

you "had a mind not to answer
my letter" about the presentation.
This expression cut me but it
really was not ^{so} bad as it seemed
to me at the time.

Your stamps were also
received in good order, but Flynn
& the Adjutant stole them from
me right off. So I shall have to
buy one of my own to put
on this letter.

I am really anxious to
know how much we can call
ourselves worth. Please send me
an exact statement of how
much was paid for our home
and how much money we have
besides that sum. Do not count
Flynn's \$500. Let me know as
soon as possible whether you
renewed a package of \$500. per
