Log-House at Annap
April 16/1863

My dear Jennie

Your note of the 11th inst
and also copy of Journal read
-me this evening.

Gen. Henry Wilson was
here to-day - he made but a
short call upon me as he
was in hurry to get back
to Gen. Hooker's quarters. He
expressed a desire to assist
me in any way in his pow-
er, but as Col. Tilton of the
22^d Mass., was with him
I could not say anything
to him of a personal nature.

As an active campaign
is now daily expected to open

I will not take - in fact I
cannot take time to look
after my personal interests.
Probably next fall will occur
the first rest which we
will have after starting. Then
I will stir myself, although
I have no hope of being treated
with any common fairness
in the mean time, yet all
may be well.

Send my fatigue suit on
as soon as possible to Mr. J.
in Washington. Gen. Griffen & Col.
McClellan think I served the
deserters right. All well here.

If here, I will write
again tomorrow. Regards to
Jacks & Misses & pet, and
O! Annie, what a caress
for yourself.
